# VOTER REGISTRATION



## HOW TO REGISTER BY MAIL

1. Complete the Mail-In Voter Registration Application, including your driver's license number and/or the last four digits of your Social Security number. If you do not provide your driver's license number or the last four digits of your Social Security number, you must send with your application a copy of a current and valid photo ID or a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document that shows your name and address. You can find the application at Mississippi's Secretary of State website under Elections & Voting at [www.sos.ms.gov](http://www.sos.ms.gov).
2. Send your Mail-In Voter Registration Application to your Circuit Clerk's office.
3. Applications must be postmarked 30 days before the election in which you wish to vote.
4. A Voter Registration Card will be sent to your residence mailing address. The Card will provide the name, location and number of the precinct in which you will vote.

## HOW TO REGISTER IN PERSON

You may register to vote in person at any of the following locations:

Circuit Clerk's office, Municipal Clerk's office, Department of Public Safety, any state or federal agency offering government services, such as the Department of Human Services.

You must register to vote 30 days before the election in which you wish to vote.
